Faculty completed (in English) the Foundational Pathway of Teaching for Student Success, an online IU professional development experience for faculty. I coordinated IU facilitators who worked virtually with participants. I conducted 12 hours of on-site workshops at each location in Vietnam to support their online work. While in Vietnam, I also consulted with the teaching center at VNU-Hanoi and University of Danang to determine how to support their needs. These initial faculty members composed the facilitator cohort that was being prepared to continue this training (in Vietnamese) with additional faculty at the three institutions.

As AVP and then Senior AVP, my portfolio centered on Student Success. With co-chairs from IU Bloomington and IUPUI, I directed the development of all internal IU software to support student success. I served as IU's liaison to the ICHE on initiatives such as Finish in Fifteen, You Can Go Back, initial development of the Indiana Common Core, and the Guided Pathways project. I met monthly with regional AVCAAs focused on improving retention at the regional campuses. I served as the IU lead on the Lilly Charting the Future grant efforts centered on career readiness and college completion. Worked with FACET to develop Teaching for Student Success, our Canvas-based professional development for faculty instructors. At the direction of President McRobbie, I worked with campus career services staff and IU Studios to build the hire iu website so Indiana employers could better access our students and connect with our career services offices. I helped develop our Canvas Career EDGE course and guided its subsequent updating and the development of a high school version. I led the UFC DMAI committee that developed more granular reporting on diversity initiatives at IU in the areas of teaching, research/creative activity and service. I co-led the UFC Joint Task Force on Course Evaluations and drafted the final report. Our recommendations to eliminate or minimize the usage of numerical results for personnel decisions and to focus course evaluations on assessing student learning outcomes was accepted by the UFC. I facilitated the work of the Teaching Pathways Committee in developing IU's teaching excellence framework. I co-led the task force that conducted a university-wide review of all of IU's campus and university-wide programs that support teaching and learning and drafted its final report. I coordinated and oversaw the project for campus review of teaching criteria for promotion and tenure and compiled the individual campus reports into a final report to the President. I also led the Combined Teaching Award/Distinguished Teaching Professor Committee and drafted its final report. The committee recommended a new pathway for faculty who seek to establish teaching excellence on our campuses, beginning with our Trustees Teaching Awards through the creation of an award recognize the highest level of teaching excellence with a new title and associated reward. Our recommendation to increase the stipends for all IU Distinguished Teaching and Service Awards was implemented.

Director, Office of Completion and Student Success (OCSS), Indiana University, 2014-2022

As director of OCSS, I supervised a staff of three who provided enterprise level support and advocacy for efforts on all campuses at Indiana University focused on student success retention, graduation, and success locating employment after graduation - by collaborating with campus partners in all these areas. I was responsible for RFPs and subsequent implementation of enterprise student-facing contracts for all 9 IU campuses including the EAB Student Success Collaborative software, Anthology Engage, Handshake, MyStudentBody, Maxient, Signal Vine and CircleIn. My staff and I provided training and troubleshooting support for all these platforms as well as internal enterprise student services tools developed at IU (Advising Records, Student Engagement Roster, Student Appointment Scheduler, iGPS degree maps and plans, and Student Online Academic Record). I directed the development of enterprise level training materials for advisors (IU Advisor Training in Canvas), the Advising Leadership Institute (in collaboration with IUHR), and our own internal life coaching training course (Coaching Conversations) which leads to BCE certification. I also worked with campus academic and career advising councils to bring them together in an annual IU-wide conference for professional development. I developed IU-wide committees that met regularly in the following areas: advising, career services, student life, and student retention. At the beginning of the pandemic, we developed an online Canvasbased orientation framework for campuses to aid them in conducting online summer orientations in collaboration with campus orientation staff.

Administrative liaison (half-time) to two Regional Blueprint strategic planning teams: Student Success, Access and Innovation and a member of the Blueprint Steering Committee. For IU, administered a portfolio centered on Academic Programming and Student Success. At the conclusion of the process, I worked as liaison to the Chancellors for three new initiatives: Advising, Research and Teaching for Regional Needs, and Organization and Planning. I developed action plans for these areas and proceeded to put them into implementation working with cross-campus committees. I also facilitated IU's English Composition tuning group (which developed a standard set of expectations for the first year writing course on all campuses), served as liaison to ICHE's LearnMore Indiana, and served on the team that developed IU's early warning software and the Academic Roadmap Committee as the regional and university-wide representative. I organized and facilitated a statewide Composition Conference for 135 college and high school composition teachers to discuss learning outcomes, assessment and bridge programs for college composition. I sent an IU team to the AACU Summer Institute on High Impact Practices to develop better use of such practices on our campuses.

Created an online events calendar and worked to better publicize faculty activities and college events in local news media. Worked with the Dean to put in place a new mechanism for hiring emergency instructors when enrollment required new sections be opened. Assisted with the transition process for a new Dean, collected data for the IU Cost Benchmarking Study, and developed a tool to assess chairs' workloads.

I took over the program after the BA degree was approved and our long-serving director decided to step down. When I left at the end of my three-year term, the program had 22 majors and 24 minors and was interviewing to add a new full-time faculty member for the coming year. Fifteen new faculty members from the Sciences, Nursing, Education, and CLAS became affiliated faculty and we had added two new adjunct instructors. The program had completed a successful external review and we were implementing its recommendations. The program had a robust schedule of yearly talks and events to engage students on campus: our yearly faculty-focused Public Forum series; the Gloria Kaufman Memorial Lecture series; and a variety of other feminist scholars as opportunities presented themselves. The department actively engaged with both our campus community as well as our external community--partnerships with Stanley Clark School to develop a self-esteem curriculum for 8th grade girls, with the St. Joseph County Health Department, Memorial Hospital, the AAUW, colleagues in gender studies at University of Notre Dame and Saint Mary's College to present talks and programming open to the community at large.
